Imagine being forcibly carried off over thousands of miles to a foreign country, where the idols Bel and Anu are worshipped instead of the true and living God. Your name is changed from one that honors God to another name that sings praises to an idol. You are subjected to a forcible education of re-programming, where you are marked to serve as an ambassador to your new

home. Your new king demands that you dine on food sacrificed to idols and bow down in worship of colossal golden idols.

How do you avoid compromising your faith in God?

This is the challenge of Daniel - a strong-willed teenager consigned to the courts of the Babylonian King Nebuchadnezzar in 606 BC. In spite of the repeated threat of death, Daniel never compromised his exceptional faith in God.

As we journey through the book of Daniel, God is going to speak to us about what it means to possess an unshakeable and unwavering faith. Whatever It Takes The 2013 Annie Armstrong Offering

Each year, we honor the life and work of Annie Walker Armstrong (1850-1938) when we give to the annual offering for North American missions named after her. As a tireless servant of God and a contagious advocate and supporter of mission efforts throughout the world, Annie Armstrong led women to unite in mission endeavors that ultimately led to the formation of Woman's Missionary Union, for which she served as the first corresponding secretary.

Annie believed in Christ with all her heart, but it was her hands that expressed that belief in tangible ways. She spent a great amount of time typing and handwriting letters in support of missions. Many of these letters were quite lengthy and all were filled with conviction that more could and should be done in our mission efforts. In 1893 alone, she wrote almost 18,000 letters! Annie also never hesitated to use her hands to reach out to hug a child or distribute food and clothing and the Word of God to those in need. Her hands held her own Bible as she studied to know how best to share God's love with others. And, most important, Annie was a woman of prayer, folding her hands in prayer to intercede for the missionaries and for those they were helping discover Christ.

Annie rallied churches to give more, pray more, and do more for reaching people for Christ. As we continue to unite to make her vision a reality in North America today, we can be confident that her legacy will also be ours.

TOP 10 WAYS to make sure that guests DON'T come back to church

- 10. Never ask a guest's name. If you somehow discover it, certainly don't call them by name. You don't want to get too friendly on their first visit.
- 9. Never sit near or beside a guest at church. If they look uncomfortable or lonely, don't worry. It's not your responsibility.
- 8. Look generally miserable. Frown often. Make it obvious that church is a serious thing and smiles are inappropriate.
- 7. Don't give guests directions to Sunday School classrooms. Hallways should be empty when guests arrive. Guests are smart enough to figure where they belong.
- 6. Don't invite a guest to Sunday School or church events. You don't want to appear too forward.
- 5. Sit at the end of a pew and allow guests to climb over you. Reserve seats for friends and hold your ground if a guest attempts to infringe. If a guest happens to sit in "your seat" in the worship service, tell them to move to another location.



- 4. Tell the guest how many years that you've been a member of the church, and inform them of how ignorant they are as far as how the church works. Speak using "inside church" terms that guests will need to learn.
- 3. Appear as bored and disinterested as possible. Count the ceiling tiles. Play on your iPhone. Look at your watch or clock often. Write a grocery list. Take a nap. Don't sing. Don't open your Bible. Don't bring your Bible. Don't take any sermon notes. Whisper loudly to your neighbor.
- 2. Snort softly if a guest arrives late. Roll your eyes if a child wiggles or speaks.
- 1. During the invitation, loudly gather up your personal belongings. Feel free to leave during the invitation, since you have important things waiting on you. The invitation is not for you ... It's for someone else that needs it.

NOTE: If your church wants to reach total strangers for Jesus Christ, do the exact opposite of these 10 items.
